Black Friday 2014 Prayer Vigil We people of faith, gather in one accord, acknowledge that God sees "...people oppressed..." and God hears "...their cry of injustice..." (Exodus 3:7-8 CBE) because of the working conditions and low wages that deprive them from fully providing their families with fair living.

We people of faith lift our voices alongside the voices of Walmart Workers acknowledging that God has sent us to end the oppression and injustice that many of our family members, friends, neighbors, parishioners and fellow human beings are experiencing within the existing working terms and conditions created to take from the needy and feed the greed of the wealthy.

God of Justice,

We lift our voices as one to implore justice, faithful love and humility. That through our imploring and toil they may become a reality in our work sites and conditions (Micah 6:8 CEB).

We lift our voices to you oh God... God of justice, hear our prayers.

You devour, but you aren't satisfied; a gnawing emptiness is within you. You put something aside, but you don't keep it safe.

That which you do try to keep safe, I will give to the sword. You sow, but you don't gather. You tread down olives, but you don't anoint with oil; you tread grapes, but don't drink wine (Micah 6:14-15 CBE).

We lift our voices oh God... God justice, hear our prayers.

God of Life,

You are abundantly generous. We lift our voices as one and plea for your mercy and grace, that our work place may become a place where we witness the end of evil; that our employer-employee relationships may become a platform where justice is sought; that we may learn to do good with one another, seek justice, help the oppressed and plead for those in distress and toil (Isaiah 1:16-17 CEB).

We lift our voices in thanks giving for showing us that power and might are meant to give life and sustenance to that which/whom exists and shares life with us.

We come before you in thanks giving for the right to endeavor and fight for that which is good and right, as is fair treatment for Walmart workers. Treatment that resembles respect and dignity. Treatment that resembles sustaining work terms and conditions that provide fair living for them and their families (Genesis 1:27-30 CEB).

We lift our voices Oh God... God of Power and might, hear our prayers.

We lift our our voices that employers and high ranking officials may acknowledge that associates are not means to gain and wealth (Proverbs 30:14 CEB). We pray that their objectives and goals may shift from high productivity to providing equality and freedom to associates.

We lift our voices Oh God... God, who is our help, hear our prayers.

Arise, oh God of Mercy,

Let us be delivered from disrespectful treatment. Let us be delivered from the margins of silence in which we have been kept. Let us be delivered from uncertainty and distress. Give us freedom Oh God of mercy from lacking conditions and wages.

Give us freedom from chains of inequality and disregard. Let us be free to thrive. Let us be free to provide for our families. Let us be free to leave behind stepping stones from our children that will lead into a promising future.

We lift our voices Oh God... God of Mercy hear our prayers.

Don't take advantage of poor or needy workers, whether they are fellow Israelites or immigrants who live in your land or your cities.

Pay them their salary the same day, before the sun sets, because they are poor, and their very life depends on that pay, and so they don't cry out against you to the Lord. That would make you guilty (Deuteronomy 24: 14-15).
