Dear Mr. McMillon:

We, the undersigned, are deeply troubled by Walmart's recent illegal and unethical attack on workers' rights. The abrupt closure of the Pico Rivera, California Walmart store is a clear and direct assault on the rights of working people everywhere to stand up for what they believe is right.

Pico Rivera has long been a hotbed for worker activism. A powerful group of primarily Latina women led the first Walmart strikes there prior to Black Friday in 2012. They held a sit-down strike, led civil disobedience outside that very store last fall and have been vocal leaders in the fight for \$15 an hour and access to full-time, consistent schedules.

The store was closed abruptly along with four others nationwide for an alleged national plumbing emergency, yet local officials in all of the locations confirm that Walmart never applied for nor received the necessary permits for such work.

As the filing notes, this is not the first time Walmart has taken dramatic action to quell worker action. In June of 2014, the <u>Canadian Supreme Court ruled that Walmart had violated labor law</u> when it closed the Jonquiére, Quebec Walmart store. The workers in that store had voted to join a union, becoming the first unionized store in North America just before it closed. In 2000, butchers in a <u>Jacksonville, Texas Walmart</u> voted to join UFCW Local 540. Two weeks later, Walmart closed its 180 meat departments in stores nationwide and switched to prepackaged case ready meat only. More recently, Walmart fired and disciplined more than 70 workers who participated in strikes in June 2013. The NLRB found merit to the claims that Walmart unlawfully fired and disciplined those 70 strikers and the <u>General Counsel of the NLRB is currently prosecuting Walmart</u> for these violations.

Given your past history, we are closely watching the National Labor Relations Board as they investigate the charge that OUR Walmart filed seeking a court order to remedy Walmart's unlawful closing of these stores.

We stand with OUR Walmart and we urge ask you to publicly commit to you to rehire reinstate all of the workers who were terminated in all five stores as soon as their stores

reopen. and reinstate them to their own stores. In the interim, pay those workers or transfer them to other stores.
