AFSCME Political Activism Benefits Our Members and Communities We Serve

And the winners are... Working families!

In a veritable clean sweep across **Los Angeles County**, voters backed candidates and measures on Tuesday that were endorsed by labor unions in the Primary Election. **Voters reelected Mayor Eric Garcetti and all of the incumbent council members** in a progressive-leaning City that employs nearly **7,000 Council 36 members in six AFSCME Locals**. Simultaneously, voters rejected an anti-development referendum -- **Measure S** -- that the LA County Federation of Labor and many others strongly opposed because of its anticipated impacts on good jobs and the economy. In another important win, a quarter-cent sales tax increase to fund County homelessness prevention programs, **Measure H**, earned the two-thirds majority needed for passage -- just barely. Championed by AFSCME allies on the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors, the measure's passage was due in part (*Story continued on back*)

In a number of additional important victories, labor-endorsed candidates and incumbents were elected in a slew of smaller cities whose municipal workers are represented by AFSCME -- from **Bellflower to Covina to Huntington Park to West Hollywood, Glendora and Pasadena**. In many cases, AFSCME members and staff volunteered to walk precincts and man the phonebanks on week ends and after work, to get out the vote -- while also successfully supporting such revenue-generating ballot measures as “CC” in Covina, which will fund vital municipal services to residents. AFSCME also made endorsements of labor-allied council and mayoral candidates in communities such as **Bell, Gardena, La Verne, San Gabriel, Vernon and Norwalk**, many of whom won.
