

Know Your IX

IN HIGH SCHOOL

Nine things you should know about your Title IX rights
and your school's Title IX responsibilities

1 Title IX is a federal civil rights law that prohibits sex discrimination in education.

2 Title IX applies to students of all genders.

3 Your school must have a clear, well-publicized procedures for responding to complaints of sexual harassment and violence.

4 Your school must be proactive in ensuring your school is safe for you.

5 Your school or school district must designate at least one employee as a "Title IX Coordinator."

6 Regardless of the outcome of any investigation, your school may not retaliate against you for filing a complaint.

7 Your school must respond to violence that occurs "off campus," including on school buses, at extracurricular activities, and online.

8 Your school should provide age-appropriate training to students on Title IX, sexual violence, consent, and your school's reporting and investigation process.

9 Your school must provide you the accommodations you need to stay in school-free of charge.
