Nine things you should know about your Title IX rights and your school's Title IX responsibilities

- Title IX is a federal civil rights law that prohibits sex discrimination in education.
  - school may not retaliate against you for filing a complaint.
- Title IX applies to students of all genders.
- Your school must have a clear, well-publicized procedures for responding to complaints of sexual harassment and violence.
- Your school should provide age-appropriate training to students on Title IX, sexual violence, consent, and your school's reporting and
