Registration details

- Students who are U.S. citizens are allowed to register at either their local addresses or their permanent addresses. It's your choice.
- Depending on the state where you want to vote, you can either register online or by paper.
- If you think you are already registered to vote, please check to be sure right now.

Get Registered to Vote!

- To register online in all states EXCEPT New Jersey, Texas, North Carolina, Arkansas, New Hampshire, Maine, South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, Mississippi, and Oklahoma, use the following link:

- You need a MI driver's license (or state ID) to register online in MI. If not, use paper.
- There are paper voter registration forms at the front that are accepted by all states if you mail them in or give them to a member of TUT. To download this form on your own, go to <http://vote.gov>.

Absentee Voting

- To obtain an absentee ballot, you may request one by mail or by going to the clerk's office where you want to vote.
- In **Michigan**, anyone eligible to vote may vote by absentee ballot.
