FILE FOR UNEMPLOYMENT!!!

DURING THE COVID 19 PANDEMIC, UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS HAVE BEEN EXPANDED WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR UNEMPLOYMENT

- <u>ALL WORKERS</u> who are furloughed, laid off, hours reduced or without work through no fault of their own because of the COVID-19 pandemic should apply for unemployment benefits.
- Now through July 31, Pandemic Unemployment Compensation will add \$600 a week to the individual benefit amount.
- <u>ALL WORKERS</u> includes: self-employed workers, independent contractors, gig workers, freelancers, workers seeking part-time work, and workers who do not have a long-enough work history to qualify for state UI benefits and workers who have exhausted their state UI benefits. (Undocumented workers are not eligible for Unemployment or Pandemic Unemployment)

- **Employment Development Department / EDD** the one week waiting period and requirement to seek work is waived for COVID 19 related unemployment. EDD is overloaded, for fastest service, file claims online
- Paid Sick Leave: Effective April 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020, workers in companies with less than 500 employees are entitled up to 80 hours of Emergency Paid Sick Leave and Expanded FMLA leave rights, subject to certain requirements and limits.
- Paid Family Leave: 6 weeks if unable to work because you are caring for family member who is ill or who is quarantined because of COVID 19 – requires medical certification. Citizenship and immigration status do not affect eligibility.
