- ✓ Support educating the public that recovery is a valuable asset to the community.

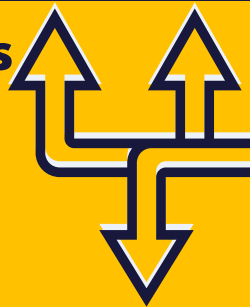


Justice

Recovery over Party

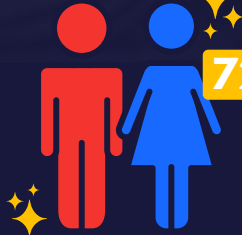
42%

Stigma

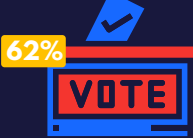
72%

Recovery Access

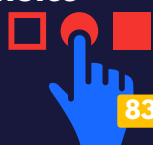
62%
