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Chambers Tied With Button

Findings from a poll of likely 2020 General Election voters in Texas's 112th State House District

A recent survey conducted in Texas's 112^{th} State House District finds Democrat Brandy Chambers essentially tied with Republican State Representative Angie Chen Button, 48-46 percent, in a rematch from $2018.^{1}$ This district is growing increasingly hostile to the Republican brand in the wake of Donald Trump. After Hillary Clinton narrowly carried this district by 1 point in 2016, Beto O'Rourke defeated Ted Cruz here by more than 9 points. Now, Joe Biden leads Trump decisively, 57-36 percent.

Button's support slides after balanced positive and negative messages, allowing Chambers to finish the survey leading outside the margin of error, 48 – 43 percent.




Figure 1: Vote Progression
