Workplace Safety

1 WHEREAS:

- 2 All workers deserve a workplace where they feel safe. Workplace violence has not only
- 3 increased in areas where we know this is a concern -- corrections, law enforcement and
- 4 behavioral health -- but in almost every occupation that works with the public: and
- 5 WHEREAS:
- 6 Workplace violence is not just limited to physical assault. It also includes near misses,
- 7 verbal abuse and sexual harassment. Even the fear of assault or witnessing an assault
- 8 on a co-worker can have serious impacts on the health and well-being of workers. This
- 9 trauma affects our members at the workplace but also in their lives outside of work
- 10 causing stress on relationships and families; and
- 11 WHEREAS:
- 12 Victims of workplace violence have an increased risk of post-traumatic stress injury
- 13 (PTSI), a disorder common among combat veterans and victims of terrorism, crimes,
- 14 rape and other violent incidents. Workers often blame themselves when they are injured
- in an assault, and management often encourages this self-blame; and
- 16 WHEREAS:
- 17 It is rare that these issues are dealt with effectively even in the short term. And there is
- increasing evidence that victims and witnesses of violent incidents need long term
- 19 treatment and support to fully overcome these problems; and
- 20 WHEREAS:
- 21 Inadequate staffing levels and lack of training leads to increased incidents of violence;
- 22 and
- 23 WHEREAS:
- 24 First responders that file workers compensation claims for PTSI are almost always
- 25 unfairly denied.
- 26 THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:
- 27 That Oregon AFSCME Council 75 will propose staffing ratios at the bargaining table and
- 28 fight for legislation to address staffing shortages; and

29	BE II FURTHER RESOLVED:
30 31	That Oregon AFSCME Council 75 will utilize its resources to conduct safety assessments of worksites with high incidents of assault; and
32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:
33 34 35 36	That Oregon AFSCME Council 75 will push for legislation to change the burden of proof from the employee to the employer during worker comp decisions so that the impacted employees are not further burdened to have to prove working conditions caused PTSI, but instead, employers must prove working conditions did not cause PTSI; and
37	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED:
38 39 40	That Oregon AFSCME will not allow these problems to persist without action and will work with members to draw attention to this important safety issue with the public and with elected officials.
