RESOLUTION 1 - FOR OREGON AFSCME TO RECOGNIZE INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY

WHEREAS, Oregon AFSCME Council 75 is committed to equity and inclusion in participation in our union and fighting to protect the rights of all workers to organize and have a voice in their workplace and community.

WHEREAS, American Indians, Native Hawaiian and Alaska Natives, referred to as Indigenous people in this resolution, have lived on these lands we all cherish since time immemorial; and

WHEREAS, Oregon and United States history is one of forced migration, broken treaties, and other injustices, laws and policies that have irrevocably impacted the lives and communities of Native people. Because of these injustices as well as institutional and structural inequities in our society, government and education systems, Native people suffer from higher poverty rates, unemployment, education disparities and lower health outcomes of any ethnic group in the country; and

WHEREAS, The perseverance and resilience of Native people in the face of these injustices is a reflection of the continued integrity and vitality of their cultures and their governments. Native people have provided unique and important contributions to every aspect of our society; and

WHEREAS, The labor movement has an important role to support Native people and workers in our state and country to work together to change policies and practices to better reflect the experiences of Native people and uplift our country's Indigenous roots, history, and contributions; and

WHEREAS, We cannot avoid difficult aspects of our past and it is important to understand the history that has brought us to reside on this land and to seek to understand our place in that history; and

WHEREAS, reading a statement recognizing traditional territories of Indigenous people is an opportunity to celebrate the thriving traditions and deeply rooted values of the Indigenous people who reside in our state and are AFSCME members, and of course, their ancestors before them;

WHEREAS, recognizing Indigenous Peoples' Day each October, is an opportunity to celebrate the thriving traditions and deeply rooted values of the Indigenous people who reside in our state and are AFSCME members, and of course, their ancestors before them; now therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED that Oregon AFSCME proclaims the second Monday in October be recognized as Indigenous Peoples' Day to honor and celebrate the many contributions made by the Indigenous peoples throughout our vibrant community, and encourage other businesses, organizations, public institutions, and community members to recognize Indigenous Peoples' Day and take time to learn and teach others about the history and cultural significance of the American Indian and Alaska Native community; and

BE IT RESOLVED that Oregon AFSCME Council 75 shall proclaim on that day a statement recognizing Indigenous lands, or similar statement:

"We acknowledge that we are on the traditional land of [indigenous people¹] who lived and flourished in this area and this includes those that continue to be stewards of this land for generations. Our community owes its existence and vitality to these people who contributed their hopes, dreams, and energy to this land. Acknowledgment is critical to building respect and connection across all barriers of heritage and difference. We pay respects to the many, diverse Indigenous peoples still connected to this land on which we gather and their elders past and present."
