## What is a convention?

- The convention is the highest ranking decision-making body of our union.
- It is essential for member-led union democracy!
- It is the gathering of all locals' delegates to make collective decisions on behalf of the entire state membership of AFSCME.

## What does it mean to be a Delegate?

- A delegate is an elected representative of their fellow AFSCME members in their home local.
- A delegate casts votes on behalf of their local.
- Delegates ensure that the decisions made are on behalf of all AFSCME members.


## Components of a Convention

- Making group decisions
- Recognizing outstanding service and achievement
- Reflecting on the two years since the previous convention.
- Electing decision-makers who will serve until the next convention (two years)


## Convention Committees

- Resolutions Committee
- Constitutional Amendments Committee
- Elections Committee
- Rules Committee
- Credentials Committee
- Sergeant-At-Arms Committee


## Resolutions Committee

- What is a resolution?
- A resolution is a statement by the convention delegates regarding priority items for our union going forward
- Resolutions can be regarding strategic direction, statements of values, identification of initiatives to which resources will be devoted, etc.
- It names specific action items


## Amendments Committee

- What is a Constitutional Amendment?
- A Constitutional Amendment is a modification to our statewide Union governing document, our Constitution
- Only the Convention has the authority to modify our Constitution
- Our Constitution governs:
- Dues
- Finances
- Membership
- Governing bodies and leadership positions, such as the Board, the executive committee, the Officers, the executive director, etc.
- Convention processes


## Elections Committee

- Overseeing all nominations and elections
- Accepting nominations
- Confirming eligibility for office
- Coordinating balloting
- Publishing results
- 6 member-delegates and 19 total staff to conduct all of the above and keep all the moving parts moving properly and on time


## Convention Rules Committee

- Who is eligible to participate?
- How do we create equitable participation?
- How do we engage in discussion and debate?
- How do we vote?


## Credentials Committee

- Ensuring that only properly elected representatives of our Locals are participating
- Ensuring that voting strength is properly allocated


## Sgt-At-Arms Committee

- The Sergeants-At-Arms plays a critical role in the function of the Convention:
- Helps delegates find what they need to participate
- Helps delegates get in the proper line to speak during discussion and debate
- Helps the chair track time limits
- Helps the chair count votes

## How to Get in Line?

- Use the Q\&A button
- Enter into the Q\&A if you want to speak for, against, or have a question
- To speak on a point of personal privilege, enter into the Q\&A
- To second a motion, type "second" into the Q\&A
- Please do not use this function for anything other than getting in line to speak
- No Chat Function
- Raised hands will not be answered


## How You will be able to Speak

- When it is your turn to speak, the chair will call on your name
- The sgt-at-arms will change your Zoom role from "attendee" to a "panelist" for speaking rights
*This moving process takes a moment. It may feel like you are being kicked out of the zoom
- Once you are moved, you can unmute yourself and we would prefer that you turn on your camera


## Voting on a motion

- A poll question will pop up onto your screen
- You may vote in favor of the motion, against the motion, or abstain from voting on the motion
- When voting on motions you are casting a single vote
- Elections are different


## Nominations/Elections

- Friday evening, nominations will be accepted for all Officer positions (see Elections slide \#11)
- Saturday morning, elections for Officer positions will be held
- Sunday morning, nominations and elections for all other positions will be held in smaller sub-groups based on representation
- Elections are "per-capita"


## Elections

- Who, or what, gets elected at the Convention?
- Officers:
- President
- First Vice President (1 of 2 senior Vice Presidents)
- Second Vice President (1 of 2 senior Vice Presidents)
- Treasurer
- Secretary
- Trustees
- Executive Committee: 17 junior Vice Presidents based on geography or employer type
- Board: Largest and highest ranking governing body


## ElectionBuddy

- When the election is live you will receive an email from Election Buddy at the same email address you received the invite to tonight's meeting
- You will have 15 minutes to cast your vote
- You will be casting the number of votes that your Local has given to you (per-capita)
