



NM House Campaign Field Director



Overview

The New Mexico House Democratic Campaign is seeking qualified candidates interested in serving as Field Director on a statewide legislative caucus campaign. This is a campaign position running through November/December 2022.

Responsibilities

The Field Director will be responsible for overseeing the 2022 field program for a diverse caucus and rigorous campaign operation. Duties include:

- Managing all aspects of the field program;
- Drafting and implementing the general election field plan;
- Training caucus members and candidates, as well as their staff and volunteers;
- Hiring, training and managing canvass staff;
- Tracking and updating a comprehensive set of field metrics;
- Maintaining strong relationships with partners and allied organizations; and
- Any other campaign related tasks, as needed.

The Field Director should expect a demanding work schedule and be available long hours, including weekends, through Election Day.

Requirements

Qualified candidates must be well-organized, highly motivated, zealously detail-oriented, and capable of thriving in a unique and challenging work environment.

Additionally, candidates must have:

- At least two campaign cycles of field experience;
- At least one campaign cycle training and managing staff and volunteers;
- Experience developing and implementing aggressive field plans; and
- Extensive experience with VAN/Votebuilder, Office Suite (Excel, Word, Powerpoint), G-Suite, and other basic software tools.

Position is based in Albuquerque, NM, but requires regular travel around the state. Access to a reliable vehicle is a must. Spanish language proficiency is desired, and will merit additional compensation.
