HMM Shows Up at 2023 AIDS Watch in Washington DC



A delegation of HMM advocates traveled to Washington, D.C. to represent Indiana at the 30th anniversary of [AIDSWatch](#), a national HIV advocacy effort. The group attended workshops that informed the group on the



concerns of people living with HIV/AIDS from around the country, focusing on policies relating to quality of life, access to health care, civil rights, aging with HIV, HIV decriminalization and federal funding. Indiana's ZIP Coalitions need your voice!



The effort is organized into 10 regional [ZIP Coalitions](#) that meet regularly. HIV Modernization is a key part of the state's [Zero is Possible Plan](#).

Each ZIP Coalition is a coordinated, community-based group that is responsible for leading regional efforts to end the HIV epidemic and eliminate HCV in Indiana, which includes engaging diverse partners, especially PWLE, and using data and information to set priorities and act strategically.

HINAC V, the fifth national training academy to educate and train people living with HIV (PLHIV), activists, stakeholders, and policy leaders to mobilize state-level advocacy to end HIV-related criminalization, will be held June 4–7, 2023, at Henry and Emory College in Emory, VA. It will also include leadership institutes for transgender, Black, Latinx, and White people dismantling racism in HIV spaces.

On May 2 The major parties (Democratic and Republican) will nominate candidates for the following offices at the Municipal Primary Election:

- Mayors
- City County council members (in Marion County only)
- City common council members
- City clerks and clerk-treasurers
- City judges (in certain cities)
- Town council members, town clerk-treasurers, and town judges in towns which have chosen to stagger terms, or to elect all town officials in 2023
- Some local public questions may be placed on the ballot in certain counties
