Wells Fargo is providing educational information to our employees in the affected branches on this important issue in accordance with federal labor law. We want everyone to have the facts they need to make a fully informed decision about union representation. If you are approached by someone who asks you to sign a union authorization card, we encourage you to get all of the facts before making a decision about whether or not to sign, as it is a legal document. As always, your manager or HR Business Representative can get answers to any questions you may have.
