Change Requires Action

Hi Todd,

As we head into a new year and a new legislative session at the statehouse, we're excited for some newly released national and regional polling research on what Americans think about HIV criminalization. Check out the midwest data insights below!

Change the Law, End the Stigma!

2024 Legislative Session: Ready, Set...

The 2024 Indiana Legislative Short Session starts January 8 and must end by March 14. New this session: Legislators are limited with the number of bills they can introduce and committee time has been reduced. As such we only expect to advocate for a few modernization changes -- keeping it simple as the session will go lighting fast! National Polling Results: HIV Is NOT A Crime!

The [Elizabeth Taylor AIDS Foundation](#) conducted a national poll on HIV criminalization in collaboration with Susquehanna Polling and Research.

Here's what Americans in the Midwest said about HIV laws:

70% believe current HIV laws should be modernized and updated to take into account current scientific knowledge about transmission. It's true - our laws are based on 30 year old science.

83% believe current HIV laws should be modernized and updated to incentivize testing and treatment. It's true - our laws discourage people from getting tested.

HIV modernization is bipartisan. In states where laws have been modernized, 87-97% of Republican lawmakers supported the bill.

ABOUT HIV CRIMINALIZATION IN INDIANA

HIV criminalization is the **prosecution and imprisonment** of people living with HIV for things that are perfectly legal or only minor crimes for people who have not tested positive. HIV criminal laws are **out of date** with current science surrounding transmission and have had zero impact on rates of HIV diagnosis.

In collaboration with Susquehanna Polling and Research, we asked Americans living in the Midwest about HIV laws. Here's what they said:

70% believe current HIV laws should be modernized and updated to take into account current scientific knowledge about transmission.

83% believe current HIV laws should be modernized and updated to incentivize testing and treatment.

80% believe people living with HIV should receive the health and treatment they need, rather than face criminal charges that discriminate and discourage proper testing, treatment, and disclosure.

HIV Modernization is Bipartisan

Since 2021, states like Missouri, Georgia, Kentucky, and Tennessee have passed bills that modernize HIV criminalization laws.

In these states, between 87% - 97% of Republican lawmakers supported the bill.

Additionally, without support from Republicans in Illinois, Nevada, New Jersey, and Virginia, HIV modernization bills would not have passed.

DOJ Issues Verdict on HIV Criminal Laws

**Game-Changer from
DOJ: HIV Criminal
Laws Violate the
Americans with**



The [U.S. Department of Justice \(DOJ\) has responded to complaints](#) filed by the Center for HIV Law and Policy (CHLP) by determining that Tennessee's enforcement of its aggravated prostitution statute against individuals living with HIV violates the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). This marks the first use of the ADA to challenge HIV criminal laws based on federal laws against disability-based discrimination.

"The implications of the DOJ's findings are far-reaching. This not only puts the state of Tennessee on notice that this is a serious issue, but it also serves as notice to other states with similar HIV criminal statutes," said S. Mandisa Moore-O'Neal, CHLP Executive Director. *"This is also an opportunity for other state coalitions organizing and educating around HIV criminalization to leverage these findings with lawmakers. In a moment where many state budgets are already tight, the possibility of new and often costly litigation may be the impetus to change these laws,"* she continued. [Read more here...](#)
