
Full Funding for Public Schools in a Post COVID Recovery Funds Era

Supporting Equity in Vermont Schools January 8, 2024



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Introduction

Over the past four years over 400 million dollars of COVID Recovery Funds has been funneled into Vermont public schools. Many of these funds went to important projects that supported students in need such as mental health counselors, targeted tutoring programs, or equity positions. As this funding wraps up in the fall of 2024 school communities need to reflect on what they have learned through this process. What impact has this influx of money had on students? Have the funds truly supported the most vulnerable students who were most impacted by COVID-19? What happens when we have schools that are being fully funded?

In this report we take stock of positions, projects, and initiatives that were funded through COVID Recovery Funds as an opportunity to reflect on the impact this funding has had. We encourage school communities to reflect critically on the ways these funds have supported students and how these investments can be sustained. <u>How are we going to continue to fund essential programs that help our students, schools and communities?</u>

About These Funds

Vermont schools received historic one time investments in public education from the Federal Government as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. This money came through three separate legislative acts and was distributed in three pots of money: ESSER I, ESSER II, ESSER III. <u>This report is</u> <u>looking solely at ESSER III</u>, which was the largest one time invest in public education in our nation's history. ESSER III has a requirement that a minimum amount of the money (20%) be spent on specific programs and activities to help make up for learning loss experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic. The rest of the money (80%) should be used for programs and services that address the "academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of all students" with a specific focus on the needs of historically marginalized students (<u>see guidance</u>).

What We Analyzed

This is a look at how schools have allocated the largest round of Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief funds, ESSER III, to date. All of the information was gathered from the official Vermont Agency of Education database*. The information is current as of January 8th, 2024.

The items highlighted for each School District/Supervisory Union is reflective of only some of the investments made with ESSER III funds. Many Districts and SUs have invested in additional areas.
